Stothill forest operations: plans afoot opposite Satan's Den!

April 2024: Lumphanan Paths Group (LPG) members met with Fred Drion of Highfield Forestry near Satan's Den on 1st April 2024. It had come to our notice that work was planned to start in early April with the building of an access road through the Stothill Wood, prior to extracting forest timber. You may have noticed that work has now started.


## Hard working volunteers clear popular Church path

Fundraising initiative: Help support your local paths group with their ongoing efforts to maintain our lovely network of tracks around the village.


We've put together a collection of greeting cards (blank), post cards and a bookmark showing scenes of our beautiful local area.

### The Comply Heritage Path Project update

In the days before the Old Schoolhouse was closed in the 1960's, The Comply was used for many years by children from the west side of Lumphanan to reach school. It is recognised as a <u>Heritage Path</u> by Scotways. Recent improvements include drainage and vegetation clearance, and future tasks include gates, fencing and fixing the footbridge. 


## Lumphanan Walks leaflet - now available in shops!


